We invite geography educators, researchers, teacher educators, and practitioners to submit abstracts for paper or poster presentations for the 2026 Conference of the Commission on Geographical Education of the International Geographical Union (IGU-CGE), to be held at the Faculty of Education, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand.

The conference theme, “Educating for Sustainability: Integrating Geographical and Interdisciplinary Knowledge, Practice and Innovation,” seeks to foster dialogue and collaboration across diverse geographical and educational contexts. It highlights geography’s unique contribution to sustainability education through the integration of disciplinary and interdisciplinary perspectives, innovative pedagogies, curriculum development, and research-informed practice that respond to contemporary global and local challenges.

We encourage submissions that explore comparative studies, innovative teaching and learning approaches, and sustainable educational practices across all levels of education, including early childhood, primary, secondary, tertiary, and teacher education. Contributions may address, but are not limited to, geographical and environmental education, education for sustainability, place-based and field-based learning, digital and technological innovation, curriculum and assessment, teacher professional learning, and policy-related perspectives.

We particularly welcome contributions that promote transformative geographical education and support learners, teachers, and teacher educators in understanding their roles and responsibilities as citizens in a world characterised by complexity, rapid change, inequality, risk, and vulnerability.

Abstracts should be written in English, be no more than 300 words, and clearly outline the proposed presentation’s aims, methods, and anticipated outcomes. Submissions should be made online on or before the 23rd of February 2026 on the conference website at <https://conference.igu-cge.org/> (participants are requested to register first, then they are allowed to submit the papers).
